Celebrating IAGI's 30-Year Legacy and History

As the geosynthetics industry reflects back on five decades of remarkable innovation and growth, it is important to honor the individuals and organizations that have shaped our journey. Among these key contributors is the **International Association of Geosynthetics Installers** (IAGI), which proudly celebrates its 30th anniversary milestone that highlights its pivotal role in advancing installation standards and supporting industry professionals worldwide.

The Birth of IAGI

Founded in 1995, IAGI was established to represent geomembrane material installers and associated industry partners including material manufactures, equipment suppliers and consulting engineers. The idea for the association was first discussed at **Geosynthetics 1995**, held at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Tennessee in early 1995. Some of the founding members and early industry pioneers included:

Raising the Bar: The CWT Program

One of IAGI's most significant contributions is the **Certified Welding Technician (CWT)** program. This initiative was designed to:

- Define standards of proficiency
- Recognize installer knowledge and experience
- Reward qualified professionals with industry certification

The program includes certifications for:

- HDPE & LLDPE
- PVC Unreinforced
- Reinforced geomembranes

The CWT program was sparked by **Frank Taylor (ALCO)** during a brainstorming session in 2002 aimed at improving upon the NICET certification, which was developed by **Dr. Robert Koerner**. While NICET, a highly regarded program focused more on theoretical knowledge and mathematical skills, it lacked practical firsthand welding and CQA assessment. **Frank Taylor, Laurie Honnigford, "Demo" Dave McLaury**, and others helped develop the hands-on approach that defines the CWT program today—now the industry standard.

Approved Installation Contractor Program (AIC)

The mission of the AIC program is to establish criteria for recognizing the geosynthetic installation companies that meet a minimum level of professionalism, experience and business practices. The program's goal is to promote better quality workmanship in the geomembrane installation industry. This program recognizes those companies who have made a commitment to implement a business strategy that strives to get the job done right the first time.

Global Expansion and Industry Engagement

IAGI's influence has grown well beyond North America, with successful expansion into many regions of the world. Key historical regions for IAGI include:

- Australia Led by Max Brady (DDT)
- South Africa Led by Piet Meyer (Aquatan)
- Central America Led by Nicky Araujo (SIGSA)
- Indonesia Led by Hartanto Legowo

GeoGames: A Showcase of Skill

A unique and engaging initiative, GeoGames started in Houston in 2019 as an in-person technician challenge. Since then, it has been further enhanced by **Philip Denis and Vincent Mondoux.** Held biennially at geosynthetics conferences, the games highlight installer skills in a fun and competitive format.
